- O Julian Bond is a leader of American civil rights movement.
- O He is smart and brave, because he led nonviolent student protests.
- O He is the first African- American nominated as vice president of the U.S, but he withdraw his name because he was too young to serve
- ⊘ He served 6 terms in Georgia senate in 1971-86.
- O He is an educator. He educate the public in civil rights movement.
- O He is a writer, he published A Time To Speak, A Time To Act
- He is a distinguished visiting professor at American University at Washington, D.C and Professor in history at University of Virginia.

The Timeline

- O Birth date: January 14, 1940
- Marriages: Pamela Sue Horowitz (March 17, 1990-present);
 Alice Clopton (July 28, 1961-November 10, 1989, divorced)
- March 1960 Is arrested during a student protest of the segregated Atlanta City Hall cafeteria.
- O 1960 Is a founding member of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC).
- O 1961-1966 Serves as the communications director of the SNCC.
- O 1961 Leaves college and begins working for the Atlanta Inquirer newspaper.

- 1965 Is elected to the Georgia House of Representatives. He is not seated because House members oppose his outspoken views against the Vietnam War.
- 1967-1974 Serves in the Georgia House of Representatives.
- O 1968 Is part of a challenge delegation from Georgia that successfully unseats Georgia's regular democrats at the Democratic National Convention in Chicago, Illinois.
- O 1968 Is nominated as vice president of the United States. He withdraws his name because the Constitution's age requirement is 35 and Bond, at 28, is too young.


- 75-1986 Member of the Georgia Senate.
- April 9, 1977 Hosts "Saturday Night Live."
- O 1980-1997 Hosts the show "America's Black Forum."
- April 2, 1985 Is arrested outside the South African Embassy while protesting against apartheid.
- 1986 Loses election for U.S. House of Representatives to John Lewis.
- March 1987 Bond's estranged wife, Alice, makes public accusations that Bond and other Atlanta public figures are cocaine users. She later retracts her statements.
- O 1990 Is ordered to pay \$2,000 a month in child support to Deborah Kaye Moore after acknowledging he is the father of her daughter, Mia Moore.
- 1992-2012 Professor at the University of Virginia teaching courses on civil rights.
- **○** 1998-2010 Chairman of the NAACP.
- 2002 Receives the National Freedom Award.

Today Bond is Distinguished Visitor Professor at American University in Washington, D.C., and a Professor in the history department at the University of Virginia. He has received 25 honorary degrees.


When Julian Bond was younger he looked like young Michael Jackson.
